

FROM THE SENIOR SCHOOL:

Year 12 students will present for their **Trial HSC Examinations** from next Monday, 27 July until Monday, 10 August inclusive. Curriculum Coordinator, Mrs Theresa Avery, has emailed all Year 12 students with reminders regarding these examinations. A copy of this email is included below for the information of parents/carers:

Dear Year 12,

I hope you are keeping well as we lead into the examination period. I just wanted to touch base during this week to reinforce a few points that will ensure the examination period runs smoothly for everyone and decreases the possibility of unnecessary stress and anxiety.

Please be aware of your responsibilities during the upcoming Trial HSC period by reviewing the Assessment Policy. The Trial HSC is the most important internal assessment period in Year 12 and, as such, you need to ensure you apply yourself with diligence to each exam and attend each and every day you have an exam.

A few reminders from me:

- *Friday is the day prior to an assessment task; **therefore you must be at school.***
- *Ensure you are aware of your exam timetable. **Highlight your schedule.***
- *If you are ill on Friday or any day during the Trial period, a carer must call the school, leave a message for myself and the Coordinator of the subject you are sitting;*

- *When you return to school, you must collect an Illness/Misadventure Form from me and return the completed form **within ONE week**;*
- *Absence during the Trial HSC period should be accompanied by a Doctor's Certificate.*
- *Examinations that are missed for any reason must be completed during the first opportunity during the Trial timetable.*
- *Bring your own equipment for your examination (calculators, pencils, erasers, spare batteries and pens and so on). Do not rely on borrowing from another student or teacher.*
- *If you have been asked to provide writing paper, this will be checked as you enter the hall.*
- *Arrive early for your exams. The timetable states the starting time - not arrival time and you will **not** be given any additional time if you are late. (We are aware that buses can sometimes be late, so please don't panic if you are in this situation. It will be taken into consideration).*
- *Follow the guidelines for driving to school.*
- *Be courteous to the remainder of the school. You may have a break between exams while classes are running. Be aware of noise, use the library well and don't bombard Mrs K in the canteen.*
- *Your teachers are here for you and want to assist you as much as possible. If you need to email your teachers during the Trial period, do so at a reasonable hour and don't expect an immediate response unless you have pre-organised this. Talk to your teachers about suitable contact points and times.*
- *School uniform is to be worn at all times during the exam period. It will be cold in the hall so please ensure you have your school jumper.*
- *Remember to use a plastic sleeve for pens, etc., clear water bottle for water, no jewellery, watches on your desk, mobile phone off and in your bag, bags in the hall foyer.*

Please use these reminders in addition to your assessment policy and directions from your teachers and examination supervisors.

If you have any questions, please see me as soon as possible. Take care and all the best for your exams.

Mrs Avery has also informed students that opportunities to change subjects and/or subject levels with BOSTES closed at the end of Term 2 with the exception of extension subjects and dropping subjects.

To ensure duty of care by the school during the Trial HSC Examination period, Year 12 students are:

- to **SIGN IN** and **SIGN OUT** of the premises if they are here at times other than an actual examination – the **SIGN IN/OUT BOOK** will be kept **in the Library, AND**
- **NOT** to use vehicles to make multiple trips from the school to and from other venues.

As mentioned last week, a program of Year 12 events and commitments for Terms 3 & 4 are included in this newsletter.

Year 11 students have commenced the process to determine **2016 School Leaders**. The process, as modified from last year, was explained to Year 11 students this week. The application pack for Senior Leader/School Captain is available to students in hard copy (from Mrs Davidson) and a soft copy (emailed by Mrs Eady). Intending applicants have been instructed to:

- Read through the application pack;
- Fill out the application forms (**Senior Leader Profile form and the Nomination Form**) and attach a school photograph with the application;
- Submit an application form by the deadline, **3 PM, FRIDAY, 31 JULY**, to the Principal's Secretary, **Ms Anne Little**.

Successful applicants to Round 2 will be notified by Friday of Term 3, Week 4. These students will need to start preparing a speech to be presented to the whole school - a draft of the speech is to be submitted for scrutiny by Monday Week 6 at 3 pm. If a student has any questions regarding this process, they are to contact the **SRC Coordinators (Mrs Eady or Miss Pearse)**.

The Year 11 **Senior Retreat** will be held at the **Uniting Church Conference Centre at Elanora Heights** in northern Sydney. It is a **MANDATORY EVENT** which will be held from Wednesday, 21 October until Friday, 23 October. Detailed information regarding the organisation and importance of this event has been sent home with students. The cost is **\$250** per student. If there are any concerns with your ability to meet this cost, please contact Principal, Peter Nicholls, at school (6552 3300).

All Seniors had an opportunity to attend the **Taree Careers Expo** at Chatham High School this week – thanks to Mrs Healey, and the Careers Advisers from the other district high schools, for facilitating this event.

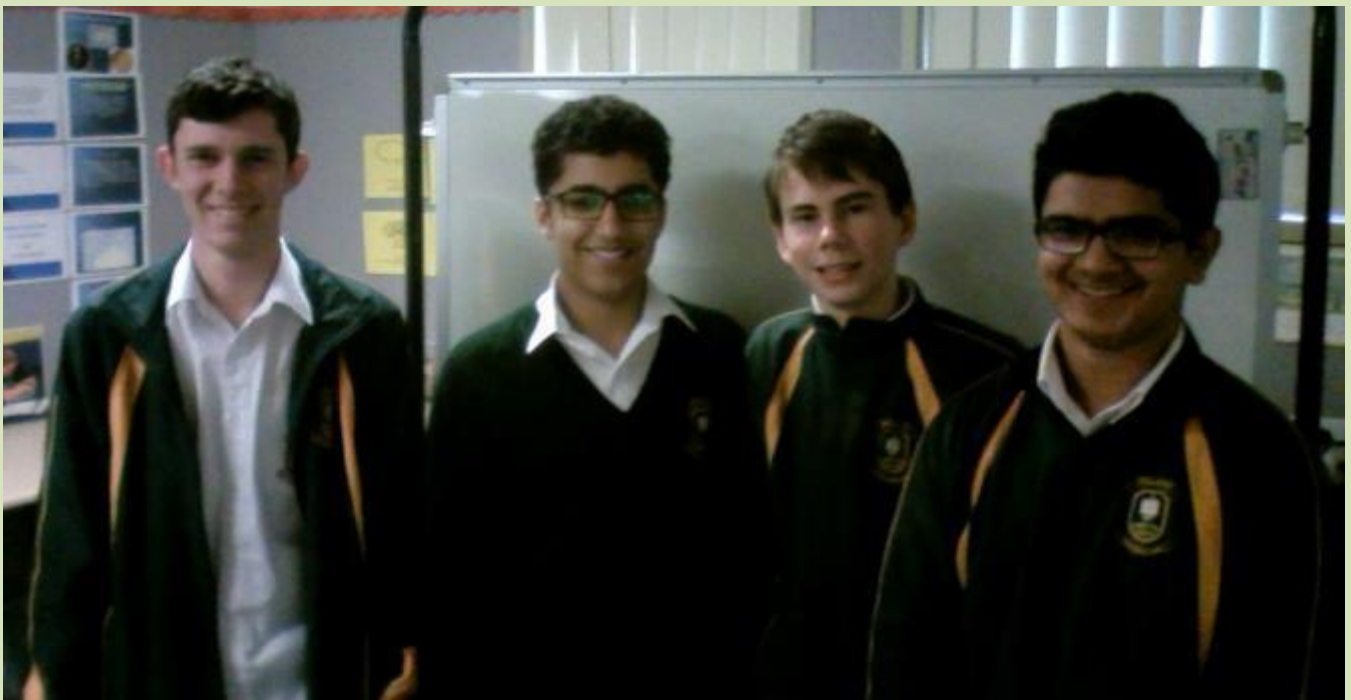

PARENT & STUDENT REMIDERS:

LEAVE NOTES & STUDENT MESSAGES: It would be appreciated if parents/guardians would send in a **written note** if their child needs to leave early for appointments etc. Notes should be handed in at the front office in the **morning before roll call**. If parents/guardians need to notify their child of a change of afternoon arrangements, it is necessary to **phone the school prior to 2:25 pm** (End of Lunch – Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday) or **prior to 1:55 pm** (End of Lunch – **Thursday Sport**) as it is often difficult to locate students if their last lesson is a PE Prac or there has been a room change.

Students cannot be collected from the school during school hours by anyone other than a parent or guardian without written permission. Thank you.

LATE NOTES: Lateness to school is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained to the school the same way as other forms of absence. **Arriving Late for school requires a handwritten note from a parent/carer or a phone call from a parent/carer** or the absence is recorded as an unexplained partial absence. Thank you.

SCHOOL CLINIC: Students are reminded that if they are unwell whilst at school they are to advise their teacher who will then send them to the Front Office. If necessary, the office staff will contact a parent while the student waits in the Clinic. **Students are not to contact parents on their mobile phones** as this leaves teachers and office staff unaware of the situation and is also in breach of the school policy – use of mobile phones. 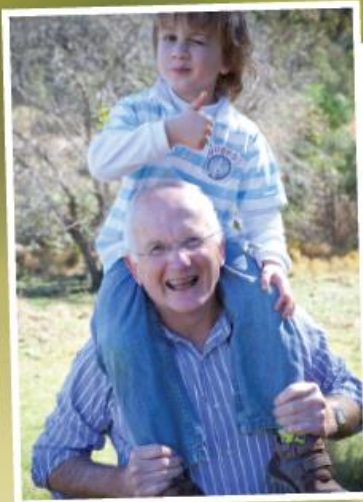
