Great advice on how to prepare for a successful audition - University of Sydney Conservatorium

Top 5 tips for students

To study at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, you will need to audition. This can be a nerve-racking experience – but it doesn't have to be. Here, students share their advice on how to prepare for your big moment.

An audition is your opportunity to show us your abilities, and it allows us to assess your skills and discuss your commitment. Here are five tips from those who've already been there to help you prepare:

1. Register for your audition online

If you can't attend in person, you can submit a video-recorded audition. Your recording must be no more than 4 months old.

2. Double check all of the requirements

Make sure you follow the audition requirements for your specialisation. If you're auditioning on an instrument or voice, remember you need to have an accompanist.

3. It all comes down to sound quality

Whatever equipment you're using to record your audition, do your best to maximise the sound quality by choosing your location carefully. If you can, try and use an ensemble room or recital hall. It doesn't need to be recorded professionally, a simple ZOOM recorder is enough.

4. It's not what you play that counts, it's how you play

When selecting repertoire, you want to play it comfortably and well. A piece that's achievable is better than going for something that's difficult. The audition panel will look for quality of performance.

5. Show your personality

An audition panel consists of musicians. Show them that you're one too and that you have a passion for music. Be technically proficient, but don't fret about technique – they'll be on the lookout for potential.

Space Weather and the Path to Mars - Einstein Lecture

17 August. 6.30pm online

The School of Physics at UNSW is proud to present this year's <u>National Sciences Week</u>'s Einstein Lecture on Space Weather and the Path to Mars. Opened by renowned astrophysicists, Professor Sarah Brough and Dr Graeme Melville, this year's speakers will be <u>Professor Iver Cairns</u> from the University of Sydney and <u>Associate Professor Susanna Guatelli</u> from the University of Wollongong,

Professor Cairns will discuss activity on the Sun's surface which creates a type of weather called space weather. Taking the form of solar flares, coronal mass ejections, bursts of X-rays, radio waves, and energetic particles that travel across interplanetary space, space weather effects at the Earth in significant ways. It damages and increases drag on satellites, causes electrical blackouts, and it also produces the Earth's aurora. Although the Earth's atmosphere and magnetic field protects us from the majority of solar wind effects, astronauts do not have the same protection from solar radiation and galactic cosmic rays. The risks from space weather to humans travelling to and living on Mars are thus large.

Great advice on how to prepare for a successful audition - University of Sydney Conservatorium

Top 5 tips for students

To study at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, you will need to audition. This can be a nerve-racking experience – but it doesn't have to be. Here, students share their advice on how to prepare for your big moment.

An audition is your opportunity to show us your abilities, and it allows us to assess your skills and discuss your commitment. Here are five tips from those who've already been there to help you prepare:

1. Register for your audition online

If you can't attend in person, you can submit a video-recorded audition. Your recording must be no more than 4 months old.

2. Double check all of the requirements

Make sure you follow the audition requirements for your specialisation. If you're auditioning on an instrument or voice, remember you need to have an accompanist.

3. It all comes down to sound quality

Whatever equipment you're using to record your audition, do your best to maximise the sound quality by choosing your location carefully. If you can, try and use an ensemble room or recital hall. It doesn't need to be recorded professionally, a simple ZOOM recorder is enough.

4. It's not what you play that counts, it's how you play

When selecting repertoire, you want to play it comfortably and well. A piece that's achievable is better than going for something that's difficult. The audition panel will look for quality of performance.

5. Show your personality

An audition panel consists of musicians. Show them that you're one too and that you have a passion for music. Be technically proficient, but don't fret about technique – they'll be on the lookout for potential.
